WACE Requirements - 2018

- Completion of 20 units or the equivalent.
- A minimum of 10 Year 12 units or the equivalent.
- Complete at least one pair of course units from both List A (Arts/Languages/Social Sciences) and List B (Mathematics/Science/Technology) in Year 12





WACE Requirements - 2018

- Achievement of at least 14 C grades (or the equivalent) or higher in Year 11 and 12 units, with a minimum of 6 C grades or the equivalent at Year 12.
- Completion of at least four Year 12 ATAR courses or of a VET Certificate II or higher VET qualification.





WACE Requirements - 2018

- Demonstration of the minimum standard of literacy and numeracy through the OLNA.
- Students studying an ATAR course must sit the external exam.





Year 12 Pathways...

ATAR

4 or more ATAR subjects. Compulsory to complete the external ATAR exams.

GENERAL

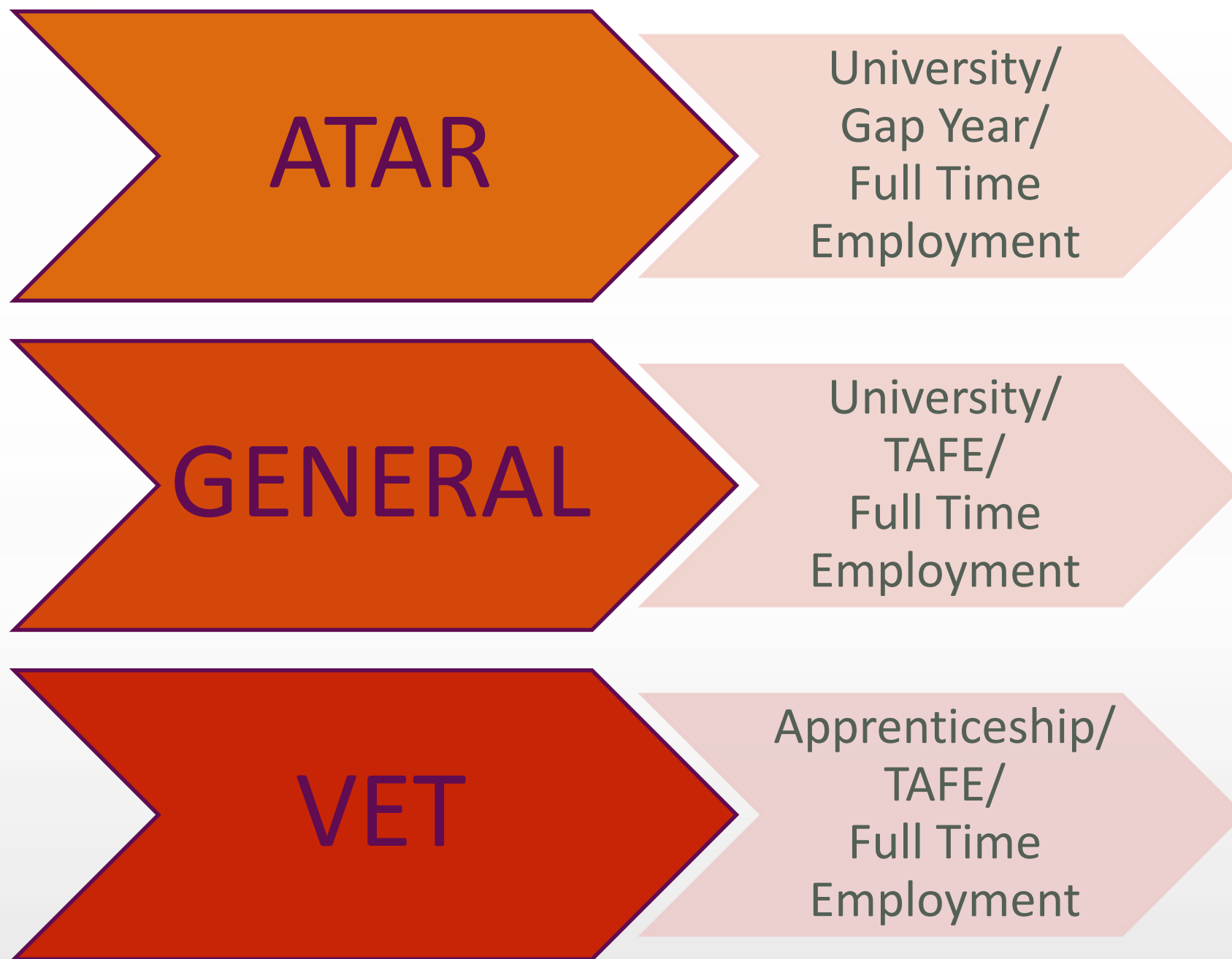
Minimum 4 General courses plus one or two Certificate II/ III/ IV course.

VET

Minimum 4 General courses, plus one or two Certificate II courses, plus INSTEP or Profile placement

Year 12 University Pathways...

What ATAR is needed?

Is there an alternate pathway available? (portfolio entry)?

What will I be studying in the course?

What job opportunities does it open up?

Can I study abroad for part of my degree?

Can I do a double degree?

Is there a practical component?





What does it mean?

- You need to be aware of the ATAR score required for your course.
- The ATAR Score is not fixed and varies from year to year.
- Scaling can have an effect on students scores, this is out of our control.
- Student performance at the examination level plays a key role.

English Language Competence ('C' in either English and Literature)

ATAR (minimum of about 70)

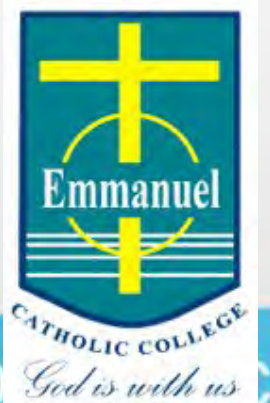

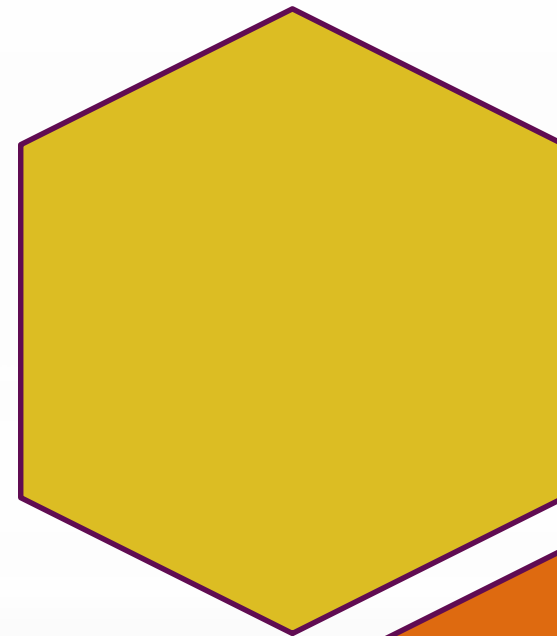

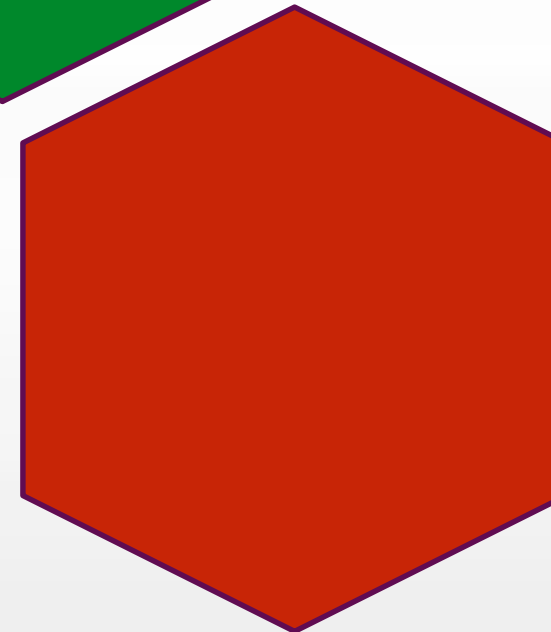


There is more than one way to get to university...

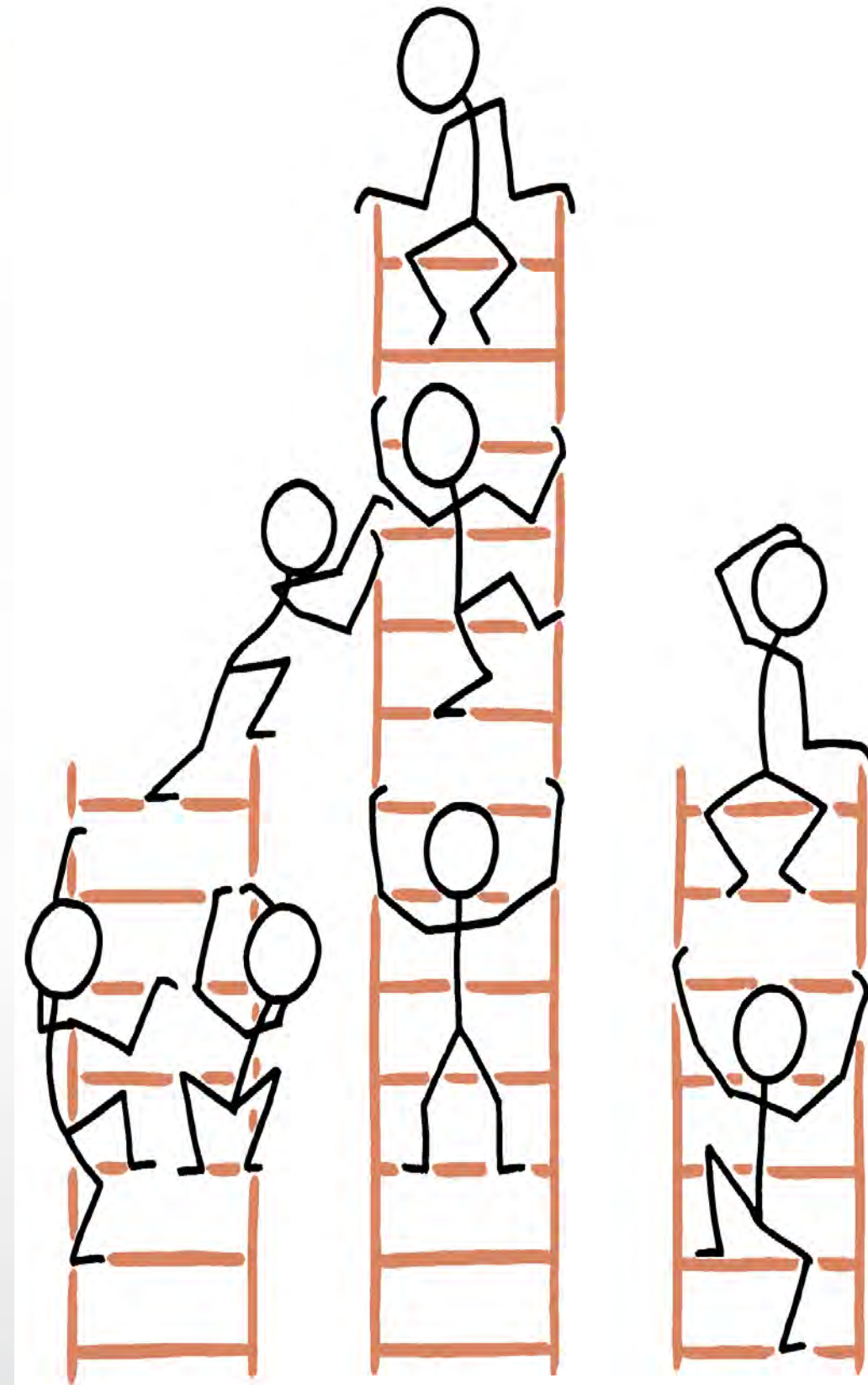
Pathway planning...
