




Completing student declaration and permission online

It is strongly suggested that all students discuss all of the questions with their parents or guardians (if under 18 years of age) prior to completing the student declaration and permission online.

1. To complete the student declaration and permission online the student can either go to:

Important:

- Year 12 students' results are available on Tuesday, 19 December 2017.
- For academic years other than Year 12, results have been sent to your postal address. These results are not available on the website.

Student number

Your student number is an 8 digit number which the School Curriculum and Standards Authority allocated to you. Typically, your student number would start with a 23.....

Password

Your initial password has been set to default as the first 2 characters of your family name (in lower case) followed by your 8-digit date of birth (ddmmyyy). A 'zero' must be entered before single digit days and months. You will be required to change your initial password. For example:


If you are unsure about your password or your account has been locked:


2. Student will then need to put in a new password and submit. This only needs to be done once when logging on for the first time.

- have read and discussed with your parent/guardian/carer the Year 12 Information Handbook, including the sections on plagiarism and malpractice;
- will comply with the examination rules set out in the Year 12 Information Handbook;
- are aware of the conditions governing the awarding of examination marks in each course;
- are aware that your marks will be forwarded to the Tertiary Institutions Service Centre (TISC);
- will attend examinations in which you are enrolled at such times and centres as may be arranged by the Authority, at your own expense;
